Central is blessed to have a team of experienced and wise parish associates who participate in the life of our community.

Lou Bender, Casey Wells and Doug Throckmorton are all ordained Presbyterian ministers who participate, can, and do provide pastoral leadership at Central. As ministers, they are members of the presbytery, but have found a home here at Central. REV. CASEY WELLS is an honorably retired member of the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area. In her late forties, Casey began to wonder "what will I be when I grow up?" She states "I returned to seminary and was ordained as a "real" pastor at age 50. My first five calls were in short-term interim ministries in unsettled congregations. With the help of colleagues, I discovered gifts in leading such churches. This led me to a 7-year Designated Pastor

Amos traveled to a temple in Israel to remind people of God's Word and speak out on behalf of those who had been neglected. The writings of Amos offer an important reminder of who we are as people of God and that no matter our circumstances, we have the ability and power to speak out for ourselves and our people.

position with a church in Lansing, MI, and then two more interim positions before I retired".

Casey participated in Central's mission trip to Puerto Rico last November and sees see such hope for Central with the church's expanded and talented staff in developing deepened community mission. Casey is a master gardener, and helps keep Central's green space beautiful. She sings in the choir, volunteers in the kitchen regularly, and preaches on occasionally. She and Doug live in downtown St. Paul.

WELCOME GUEST GUITARIST JIM FALBO!

Joining us in worship on July 28 is Jim Falbo. Jim is an eclectic and accomplished classical/acoustic guitarist, composer, instructor, performer, and music arranger from St. Paul.

Jim's music has been featured on Classical MPR 99.5 KSJN and 88.5 KBEM Jazz radio throughout Minnesota, Jim started playing guitar at the age of 11 after growing up listening to Led Zeppelin, Eric Clapton, The Beatles, and many 90's alternative bands on the radio. His love of many forms of music developed into a passion for classical and acoustic guitar, when he studied with guitarist Dean Harrington at K & S Conservatory of music. Jim has received shining reviews and is well known as a "guitarist's guitarist" from audiences and musicians alike with an ability to play such a wide range of genres and styles. Jim plays classical European, Latin, contempor ary, gypsy jazz, world music, pop classics, and acoustic fingerstyle guitar. Jim is a high demand and award-winning performer and plays



in many settings including concerts, weddings, corporate events, and various other venues and events throughout the Twin Cities and Upper Midwest.

He has played in various guitar society events including the annual Classical Guitarathon and Minnesota's Local Artists Series. as well as a Classical Minnesota Public Radio's Pop--Up Classical series. Jim draws a loyal following to his intimate and entertaining concerts, which many describe as "simply inspiring." His performances attract a wide variety of listeners throughout Minnesota while performing pieces from his expansive and distinct repertoire. Jim has written and recorded several works for the guitar. His compositions are heavily influenced from the romantic era, with European, South American, and even flamenco guitar influences. He has recorded four albums - Strings of Passion (2008) Sounds of Europe (2013), Latin American Guitar Legends (2014) and his most recent release Guitar Reveries (2016).


