On this first Sunday in the season of Lent, we jump back to an early story from Jesus' ministry, the story of his facing temptations in the wilderness (Luke 4:1-13). The temptations we face can be real and powerful. Central Choir sings. Following worship, Grades 3-8 "Sticks and Steel" rehearsal from Noon - 12:30 p.m. in the Choir Room (See page 7).

In Lent, we encounter passages of threat and warning. foreshadowing of the cross comes heavily through the gospel stories. In

our passage for today (Luke 13:31-35), Jesus receives a warning that Herod wants to kill him. Yet Jesus does not cower; and his course is set toward Jerusalem. Central Choir sings.

SESSION PASSES NEW MEDIA USE POLICY

As part of the recent rebranding efforts at Central, we have been working to better illustrate the culture and community of Central in our communications, including an increased use of photographs through social media channels.

Photographs of worship activities and our members brings our website and social media to life, providing a window into the vitality and friendliness of the community that gathers at Central each Sunday. Accordingly, as we continue working to grow our congregation, you may see more and more of our staff photographer during worship and other Central activities.

With that in mind, Session has approved the following policy for our member and visitors.

When you enter a worship service at Central Presbyterian Church or a church-sponsored event, you will be entering an area where photography, video and audio recording may occur. By participating in these events, you consent to photography or video recording being used in Central marketing materials, including but not limited to: websites, social media, newsletters, brochures, advertisements, displays, etc.

Our photographers and staff will aspire to abide by the following:

 To ensure the privacy of photographed subjects, personal identifying information – beyond the use of full adult names - will not be used in any publications, videos, displays, websites or social media.

- We may identify children or youth and if so, by first name only, in any publications, videos, displays, websites or social media.
- 3. We will not tag anyone in social media posts, but instead allow our congregants, staff and visitors to tag themselves as they see fit on pages sponsored or managed by Central.
- 4. Subjects of images may receive digital copies of published images at no cost.
- 5. If copyright for a photo or video is held by someone other than Central Presbyterian Church, we will receive permission to post it and provide credit if desired by the photographer.
- 6. We will gladly remove any photo or video upon written request from our online websites, social media and resource files.

If you or your children wish to not be photographed or appear in our publications, displays or online media, please do any one of the following:

Email Christie Rachelle, Director of Communications, at cpc@christierachelle.com, and provide the name of those who should not be photographed and include a photograph of said persons for reference, if possible. Central will use the




photo for identification purposes only and will hold it in confidence.

- Contact Anna Sanchez, Church Administrator, in the office during normal church hours at office@cpcstpaul.org. She will provide you with the necessary form to ensure we properly document your request.
- Make your wishes known to the photographer in person at the time of photography.
- Complete and submit the revocation form on our website at www.centralforgood.org/ photography.
- If circumstances change and you wish to reverse or modify your decision, please speak with the church administrator.

By participating in Central worship or events or by failing to notify Central of your desire to not have your image used, you are agreeing to release Central from any and all claims involving the use of your picture or likeness.



VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Last year we joined forces with the House of Hope Presbyterian Church to offer vacation Bible school. It was deemed a good success with our staff and kids working and having fun together. This year we are expanding the partnership! This summer Central will be partnering with Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in St. Paul to offer a fun vacation bible school experience for the children and youth of Central.

Vacation Bible School will be held at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church (700 Snelling Ave S, St Paul, MN 55116) on June 17-21, 2019 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Cost is \$40 per participant, which includes t-shirts, snacks and materials. Scholarships are available for those who need assistance in order to participate.

The Preschool and Elementary Vacation Bible School program is open to children who are 4-years-old by September 1, 2019, through Grade 4, completed by June 2019. Online registration opens by Easter (available on their church website).

A joint afternoon program is being considered. We will send updates as soon as we have them. If you plan to participate and would like an afternoon extension for your child please email Rev. Colby at dcolby@cpcstpaul.org so we can send along your preference during the planning period.

ROAR Vacation Bible School is where Life is Wild! God is Good! Children will explore God's goodness and celebrate a ferocious faith that powers them through this wild life. Each day at Roar VBS children in small groups will explore different stations to deepen their understanding of the daily Bible point. The children will also gather together for the fun-filled sing and play while collecting Bible Buddies to take home that include the special Bible verse for that day.



PROJECT NEWS FROM THE FACILITIES COMMITTEE

Check out the new water fountain! Thanks to generous donations from several members, the old water fountain outside the sanctuary on the main floor has been replaced. The new fountain is ADA compliant and has a bottle-fill option. It is located in the hallway outside the elevator on the main level.

If you haven't been upstairs to the lounge in a while take a minute to see the new look. This project began in 2017 with a generous donation from a member. The goal was to refurbish the lounge so that it would be more functional and attractive. We began by replacing the 1970'sera shag carpet and repainting the walls. One side of the children's bathroom next door was remodeled into a small storage closet. The front portion is now furnished with a modular conference table and chairs, that can seat up to 14 and has electrical outlets and USB ports. This area was the perfect setting for the telephone and video interviews conducted during the search for an associate pastor. The second half of the room is now furnished with comfortable furniture intended for informal gatherings. We are very grateful to the many volunteers who helped with this project.

The latest project is to remodel the former copy room to create an office for the new associate pastor. We were excited to find out that this is where the associate pastor's office was located long ago. We hope this will be completed by the end of February. 
Bring a swimsuit and towel to church and plan to walk through the skyways after lunch for swimming, fun and good conversations!


